Mico Lucide was an Atlantic County coordinator of Bernie Sanders' campaign for the Democratic Presidential nomination last year. That's where most of Our Revolution - Atlantic County met him.

We've seen him in action for almost two years; he is a reliable voice for positive change. He's running on a Green Party line. We trust him.

The day after the killing of Heather Heyer, a woman protesting white supremacy in Charlottesville, Virginia, Mico helped spread the word about the first Atlantic County demonstration in response, supporting racial equality and opposing hate.

Mico has proposed a reform of public education funding that would reduce property taxes for New Jersey residents. Another of his money-saving proposals would overhaul management of state-government contracts, ending wasteful extensions.

Mico calls for New Jersey to use union labor in all state projects. He has consistently advocated a \$15 dollar per hour minimum wage, with two years of tax breaks for small businesses to ease the transition to a living wage.

He favors legalizing and taxing marijuana. He's been a reliable supporter of gender fairness and LGBT rights.

Why should a voter wanting positive change in New Jersey vote for Mico instead of incumbent Vince Mazzeo? The silence of Mazzeo and all South Jersey Democrats on the proposal to “privatize” Atlantic City’s Water Authority speaks loudly on this question.

The Water Authority has a permit allowing it to take from the ground much more water than Atlantic City uses. If the Authority is sold, the permit goes with it. New Jersey American Water is the leading candidate to buy the Authority, at a bargain price. Philip Norcross, official lobbyist for New Jersey American Water, is the brother of political boss George Norcross. Although a Democrat, George Norcross supported Chris Christie’s runs for governor after Christie, in 2006, chose not to indict him over the FBI’s Palmyra Tapes which captured Norcross threatening elected officials and local government officers.

Neither Vince Mazzeo nor any other South Jersey Democrat has called out the back room deal over Atlantic City’s water, nor supported the petition campaign in which over two thousand Atlantic City residents registered opposition to it.

Mico Lucide and the Green Party worked for the petition campaign and oppose the privatization of Atlantic City water.
